Monthly - To do's

- *Get your color planted this month, the earlier the better. Nov 15 is the average first freeze date for our area.*
- *Take house plants inside before the first freeze. Be careful not to bring in pests with them*
- *Apply pre-emergent to your turf and beds if you have not done so*
- *If you have a Koi pond stop feeding fish when the temperature drops toward freezing. The fish will begin to go into a hibernation state and are not able to process food.*

Fall Chores

Plan to trim your trees that have large branches that need to be removed.

Remove perennial foliage after it has browned. .

If you want holiday lights up by Thanksgiving, start the process now! don't wait until a week before.

Check that your pool and irrigation freeze guard systems are operational and ready for that first deep freeze that can crack pipes and equipment.

Clean and oil tools that will not be used and stored away for the winter.

Check guidewire's on your trees, make sure they are not girdling the tree nor so loose they provide no real support to offset the winter winds.
